**Directory of Local Scholarships
2024**

Through the generosity of the PTA's, school organizations in the Hicksville community, local organizations and individuals, a substantial number of scholarships are available to graduating seniors of Hicksville Senior High School. The purpose of these scholarships is to help deserving students meet the cost of preparing for their futures. Scholarships are not limited to the college bound and neither are they restricted to outstanding scholars. Students who have conscientiously applied themselves and have taken advantage of the high school educational opportunities should carefully review this directory and apply for all financial opportunities to help them achieve the next step toward their college and career goals.

This Directory presents a brief description of all local scholarships offered to members of the June 2024 graduating class of Hicksville High School. They have been numbered for identification purposes. Please note that there are opportunities for all students. Awards are available to students planning to attend college, technical school or trade school.

Review the descriptions in the Directory carefully and **apply only for those scholarships for which you meet the eligibility requirements**. Follow the instructions when filling out the application forms, which are included in the Directory (pages 24-28). The application is also available online as a fillable application. Carefully answer every question and include all information requested. Detach the application (pages 24-32) and return it to the Guidance Office, or print it out for submission. All additional applications are available in the Guidance Office as well as online (see links on page 33).

1. Charles Wagner American Legion Post 421 Memorial Scholarship

Amount: \$500.00 Criteria: Any worthy senior student who is the descendent of any honorably discharged veteran or service person currently on active duty. Scholarship may be applied toward tuition expenses of any post-high school education or training. **TO BE CONSIDERED FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP, STUDENT MUST ATTACH ELIGIBILITY FORM TO APPLICATION.**

2. The Association of Retired Hicksville School Employees Scholarship

Amount \$750.00 Criteria: The scholarship will be awarded to a graduating Hicksville High School senior. The student must be in good academic standing, and attending a two- or four-year college. Student activities are to be a factor, and involvement in community service is necessary. The student **must submit an essay** as to why he/she should be considered for this scholarship.

3. Music Parents Association/Theater Scholarship

Amount \$500 One scholarship will be awarded. Criteria: Applicant must be a graduating senior of Hicksville High School and applied to a two or four-year college or university. Applicant must have participated in Hicksville High School's theater programs for at least three years. **Write an essay of 150 words minimum** to advise an incoming freshman about why they should participate in a theater program at Hicksville High School.

4. Music Parents Association/Art Scholarship

Amount \$500 One scholarship will be awarded. Criteria: Applicant must be a graduating senior of Hicksville High School and applied to a two or four-year college or university. Applicant must have participated in Hicksville High School's art programs for at least three years. **Write an essay of 150 words minimum** to discuss how your experience in an art program has helped shape your life.

5. Music Parents Association/Music Scholarship

Amount \$500 Two scholarships will be awarded. Criteria: Applicants must be a graduating senior of Hicksville High School and applied to a two or four-year college or university. Applicants must have participated in Hicksville High School's music programs (orchestra, choir, and/or band) for at least three years. **Write an essay of 150 words minimum** to advise an incoming freshman about why they should participate in a music program at Hicksville High School.

6. Music Parents Association/Marching Band Scholarship

Amount \$500 Two scholarships will be awarded. Criteria: Applicants must be a graduating senior of Hicksville High School and applied to a two or four-year college or university. Applicants must have participated in the Hicksville High School Marching Band or Color Guard for at least three years. ***Winter Guard and/or Winter Percussion participation do not qualify.*** **Write an essay of 150 words minimum** to describe your Marching Band and/or Color Guard experience and what it means to you.

7. Music Parents Association/Ms. Gina Pellettiere Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$500 Two scholarships will be awarded. Criteria: Applicants must be a graduating senior of Hicksville High School and must have applied to a two or four-year college or university. Applicants must have participated in the Hicksville High School Marching Band or Color Guard for at least three years. *Winter Guard and/or Winter Percussion participation do not qualify.* **Write an essay of 150 words minimum** to describe how *you* exemplify Ms. Gina Pellettiere's spirit. Ms. Pellettiere was a Hicksville High School alumnus and drum major during her time with the Marching Comets in the 1990s. Ms. Pellettiere was tragically killed on Thursday, September 21st, 2023 in a bus accident on her way to band camp with her Farmingdale High School Marching Band students. As the Director of Band at Farmingdale High School, her passion for the band and "larger than life personality" made her a beloved member of her school and community. 8. The Botta Family Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: To be awarded to a senior planning to pursue a career in education. Sue and Nick Botta, members of the Hicksville High School Class of 1980, thrived in classes with caring and compassionate teachers. It was in this environment that Sue developed her passion for learning and began to consider a career in education. After graduation from college, Sue embarked on a decades-long career as an educator, working at all levels from pre-K to her current role as a high school special education teacher. This scholarship is offering one \$500 award to a senior planning to pursue a career in education. Academic performance and activities related to children will be considered. **An essay of not more than 500 words is required** describing why you want to become a teacher.

9. Burns Avenue PTA Eve Borja Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: The student must be a graduate of Burns Avenue School and eligible for a Hicksville High School diploma. They must be an average or above average student who plans to pursue a career in the visual or performing arts. He/she must show an interest in learning and want to continue his/her education either through college entry or vocational training. To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA scholarship at the time of selection.

10. Burns Avenue School PTA Dorothy Stein Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: The student must be a graduate of Burns Avenue School and eligible for a Hicksville High School diploma. They must be an average or above average student who is continuing his/her education. To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA scholarship at the time of selection.

11. Burns Ave School PTA Elizabeth Obremski Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$500.00. Criteria: The student must be a graduate of Burns Avenue School and eligible for a Hicksville High School diploma. They must be an average or above average student who plans to pursue a career in education. To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA scholarship at the time of selection.

12. Burns Ave School PTA Mary Price Special Achievement Scholarship

Amount \$500.00. Criteria: The student must be a graduate of Burns Avenue School and eligible for a Hicksville High School Diploma. They must be a student who has overcome personal and/or physical adversity and can explain how they have overcome this adversity. He/she must show an interest in learning and must want to continue his/her education either through college entry or vocational training. To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA scholarship at the time of selection.

13. Coach Bob Hilsky Memorial Baseball Scholarship

Amount \$500.00. Criteria: The student must be a graduating senior from Hicksville High School on the Varsity Baseball Team. The award will be presented to a player who demonstrated outstanding commitment, teamwork, and character both on and off the field. The Varsity Baseball Coach along with Bob Hilsky's family will select the recipient once a year. The student will receive a trophy and their name will be added to a Perpetual Plaque which represents the scholarship.

14. Mary D'Andrea Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: Any student having attended Lee Avenue School, graduating from Hicksville High School, who will be pursuing a degree in education or any medical field. The student must have shown a commitment to community service and shown great improvements academically over the years and must also have characteristics that demonstrate selflessness and empathy for others.

15. Dutch Lane PTA Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: Student must be a graduate of Dutch Lane School. Student must have continued in the Hicksville school system and be graduating from same. The student will be going onto further education - college, vocational, trade, etc. The student will be eligible if he/she also received another scholarship, except if another PTA or PTSA scholarship. The student should receive the higher of the scholarships. Applicant should have participated in at least one school and/or student activity such as school sports, clubs, or student committees. Outside employment and volunteer work are also taken into consideration.

16. Dutch Lane PTA Susan Strauss Leadership Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: Student must be a graduate of Dutch Lane School, maintaining a grade point average of 75% - 100%. Students must have continued in the Hicksville school system and be graduating from same. The student will be going onto further education - college, vocational, trade, etc. The student will be eligible if he/she also received another scholarship, except if another PTA or PTSA scholarship. The student should receive the higher of the scholarships. Applicants should have participated in at least one school and/or student activity involving the fine or performing arts. Outside employment and volunteer work are also taken into consideration

17. Annual East Street PTA Scholarship Fund

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: Awarded to either one boy or one girl. Student must be a graduate of East Street School and a graduate of Hicksville High School. The student must be going on to further education such as college, vocational, trade, etc. Show an interest in community and school activities, be of average academic standing. In the case of a tie, financial need will be the deciding factor. To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA scholarship at the time of selection.

18. East Street PTA Rededication Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: Awarded to either one boy or one girl. Student must be a graduate of East Street School and a graduate of Hicksville High School. The student must be going on to further education such as college, vocational, etc. Maintain 80% average overall and **submit two letters of recommendation from previous or current teachers showing exceptional effort in their academic studies.** To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA scholarship at the time of selection.

19. The East Street PTA/Sarah Grace Weippert Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria Awarded to a Hicksville High School graduating student who is also an East Street Elementary School graduate, male or female. Recipient must attend a two (2) or four (4) year college and must pursue a degree that requires creativity. Must have a grade point average of 85% or better, with good attendance as well as good disciplinary record. The candidate should have a strong desire to excel through hard work and practice, must be easy going and non-judgemental and show a willingness to help others. This scholarship should be given to a bright energetic self-starter who is both patient and persistent in achieving his/her goals. To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA scholarship at the time of selection.

20. East Street PTA/Anthony Paraskakis Memorial Scholarship

Amount: \$500.00 Criteria: The student must be a graduate of East Street Elementary School, graduating from Hicksville High School and will be going on to further their education at a two or four year college/university or vocational trade/commercial school. Anthony Paraskakis attended East Street Elementary School, Hicksville Middle School and Hicksville High School. He was a member of the Hicksville Lacrosse and Football teams. This scholarship will be awarded to someone who embodies Anthony's spirit of kindness, humor, determination, and acceptance. Anthony's spirit will live on through this scholarship through the recipient who has committed to further themselves through education, extracurricular activities, and community involvement. **Please submit a letter of recommendation from a previous or current teacher or staff member.** To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA scholarship at the time of selection.

21. Scholarship In Memory of Andrew LiCalsi

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: (1) The student plans to attend a two or four year school pursuing an education in business. (2) The student does not need to have an outstanding academic record but must have studied their best to achieve an average of 80%-85%. (3) The student should have an outgoing personality and care very much about the well-being (physical and emotional) of others.

22. Eyes of Learning, Inc. Scholarship in Honor of Elaine Resnik for Service to School and Community

Amount (2) \$500.00 each for a total of \$1,000.00. Criteria: These scholarships will be awarded to two seniors who are graduating from Hicksville High School. These students must exemplify the spirit of Brotherhood by their motivation, commitment and sincerity in the acts and deeds they perform in the area of human relations. These students must participate in school activities and community service. The students must demonstrate a spirit of cooperation, good-will, understanding,

kindness, respect and compassion for others. The Eyes of Learning, Inc. is Long Island's oldest and most respected non-profit metaphysical, holistic and spiritual teaching and learning organization.

23. Eyes of Learning, Inc. Scholarship in Memory of Greg Brzozowski for Service to School and Community

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: This scholarship will be awarded to one senior who is graduating from Hicksville High School. This student must exemplify the spirit of Brotherhood by their motivation, commitment and sincerity in the acts and deeds they perform in the area of human relations. He or she must participate in school activities and community service. The student must demonstrate a spirit of cooperation, good-will, understanding, kindness, respect and compassion for others. The Eyes of Learning, Inc. is Long Island's oldest and most respected non-profit metaphysical, holistic and spiritual teaching and learning organization.

24. Fiorese Family Medical Scholarship

Amount \$250.00 Criteria: The Fiorese Family Medical Scholarship is established to honor our son, a graduate of Hicksville High School Class of 2023. He has battled multiple illnesses since he was 12 months old and always handled it with grace and a smile. We would like to give back to a school district that helped him all these years. This scholarship is for any graduating senior of HHS class of 2024 who has been diagnosed with any type of cancer or a serious, chronic or long term illness. Preference will be given if you were diagnosed in any grade from K-12. Financial need and grades are not a consideration. Write at least 1 paragraph on how your illness affected your school experience and how you have coped with it during your time as a student.

25. Fork Lane PTA Jeremy Katz Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$250.00 Criteria: Any student, having attended Fork Lane School, graduating from Hicksville High School, with a high interest in Art and/or has overcome a difficulty (illness, disability or physical disability). To be awarded to a student who has not won any other PTA Scholarship at the time of selection.

26. Fork Lane PTA Scholarship

Amount (2) \$500.00 each will be awarded to two students. Criteria: Student must be a graduate of Fork Lane School. Student must apply to be considered. Any student who attains an overall academic average of 85% or better and shows social involvement, community service and/or student activities will be eligible. A student who will be going on to any further education will be eligible. The scholarship will be given upon proof of acceptance to the school of his or her choice. No financial statement is to be required for this scholarship. Must be a graduating senior at Hicksville High School.

27. Fork Lane PTA Walter W. Gaylor, Jr. Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$250.00. Criteria: A Fork Lane student graduating from Hicksville High School and attending any form of higher education. Student must show an interest in good citizenship and a desire to help others. Student need not have an outstanding academic record, but must have studied to his/her best to achieve a grade point average of 80% or higher and possess a good attendance record.

28. The Bridget Marzillo/Herzlinger Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$500.00. Criteria: The student should be a scholar/athlete with a 3.2 GPA overall (or higher) and must be planning to continue their education in a two- or four-year program. The student should be pursuing a career in the healthcare/medical field. Bridget was a very dedicated employee of the school system for 30 years and her concern and passion along with enjoyment working with young people was fantastic! Bridget's career was spent mostly at Willet Avenue School where she started as the school RN.

29. Galileo Galilei Lodge #2253 Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: To the student who over the course of four years, achieves the highest grade in study of the Italian language. **Subject to approval from the scholarship committee.**

30. The Grace J. Fippinger Foundation, Inc. Scholarship

Two (one male and one female) scholarship grants in the Amount of \$20,000 each, payable \$2,500.00 per semester for the four years of undergraduate education. To be awarded to deserving seniors who might otherwise be unable to attend the college of their choice. Students will be required to maintain a satisfactory grade point average, and demonstrate a commitment to community service. **Students who win this award will be required, at the end of each school year, to send the Fippinger Foundation a copy of their most recent grades and a letter outlining the community service they have or plan to perform. Students failing to do so, will forfeit the scholarship. Please provide a written statement as to why you are deserving of this scholarship.** Exclusions- Family members of teachers and staff of the Hicksville Public School system.

31. The Ricky Greene Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$1,000.00 Criteria: Student must be a graduating senior who has made a significant contribution to the Hicksville High School theater program through active participation both backstage and onstage. The student must have an overall average of 80 or above and must be planning to attend a two year or four year college. An activity sheet must be included with the application. Financial need is not a requirement.

32. Henry Euler Mathematics Education Scholarship

Amount Two (2) at \$500.00 each. Criteria: The student must pursue academic studies in the field of Mathematics/Education leading to a career as a secondary mathematics teacher. If only one student is deemed worthy of this scholarship, then he/she will receive the full \$1,000.00.

33. Hicksville Public School Staff Memorial Scholarship

Amount Two (2) at \$500.00 each. Criteria: Students who will be attending a two- or four-year college or university. Economic need, academic potential and willingness to perform community service to help others or improve the quality of life of the area.

34. Hicksville High School Alumni Foundation (HHSAF) Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: Student must have attended Hicksville Public Schools Elementary, Middle and High Schools and be graduating in Class of 2024. Must have been an active participant in at least one club/team/activity each year in HS. Must have a commitment to a 2 or 4 year college or trade/commercial school.

35. Hicksville American Soccer Club (HASC) Dave Daly Scholarship

Amount \$1,000.00 The Scholarship Committee will determine at the time of selection how many scholarships will be granted to either the "Public or the Private" school applicants. **Criteria:** Student must be a graduating High School senior the year of the application, have a minimum overall high school average of 80%, and plan on attending a university, college, or trade school in the fall following graduation. Student must be playing soccer either for their High School, HASC, or other certified soccer organization in their senior year. Every applicant **MUST** have played 3 years of travel soccer in the HASC. With all things being equal preference will be given to an active HASC player. **Students must include the following with the application: two letters of recommendation, official transcript, brief resume, and an essay of 250 to 500 words on ONE of the following: "How soccer has affected or influenced your life", "In your years playing for the HASC, how has it influenced your life?", OR "What has soccer done to positively affect your life?"**

36. Hicksville Soccer Scholarship in Honor of Frank Minton

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: The student should be a graduating senior of Hicksville High School with a minimum average of 85% who plans to attend at least a 2 year program to further their education. The student should have a minimum of 5 years playing Hicksville Club soccer. The student must submit an activity sheet and indicate years of participation, the team name, the coach's name, and years played.

37. Hicksville Athletic Booster Club Female Comet Scholarship

Amount (6) \$500.00 Criteria: Student must be graduating from Hicksville High School and continuing their education in a two- or four-year program. Student must participate on an athletic team their senior year. Student must be well rounded, active in the community and in academic good standing. All things being equal, athletic commitment in the High School athletic programs and HABC membership may be considered.

38. Hicksville Athletic Booster Club Female Scholar Athlete Scholarship

Amount (1) \$500.00. Criteria: Student must be graduating from Hicksville High School and continuing their education in a two- or four-year program. Student must have maintained an academic GPA of 90 or above. Student must participate on at least on Hicksville High School athletic team their senior year. Student must be well rounded. All things being equal, HABC membership may be considered.

39. Hicksville Athletic Booster Club Male Comet Scholarship

Amount (6) \$500.00 Criteria: Student must be graduating from Hicksville High School and continuing their education in a two- or four-year program. Student must participate on an athletic team their senior year. Student must be well rounded, active in the community and in academic good standing. All things being equal, athletic commitment in the High School athletic programs and HABC membership may be considered.

40. Hicksville Athletic Booster Club Male Scholar Athlete Scholarship

Amount (1) \$500.00. Criteria: Student must be graduating from Hicksville High School and continuing their education in a two- or four-year program. Student must have maintained an academic GPA of 90 or above. Student must participate on at least on Hicksville High School athletic team their senior year. Student must be well rounded. All things being equal, HABC membership may be considered.

41. Hicksville Athletic Booster Club Outstanding Female Athlete Scholarship

Amount (1) \$500.00. Criteria: Student must be graduating from Hicksville High School and will be continuing their education in a two- or four-year program. Student must participate on two Hicksville High School athletic teams her senior year and receive league honors (All-League, All-Conference, All-County, etc.) during any varsity season. Student must be well rounded and in academic good standing. All things being equal, HABC membership may be considered.

42. Hicksville Athletic Booster Club Outstanding Male Athlete Scholarship

Amount (1) \$500.00 Criteria: Student must be graduating from Hicksville High School and will be continuing their education in a two- or four-year program. Student must participate on two Hicksville High School athletic teams his senior year and receive league honors (All-League, All-Conference, All-County, etc.) during any varsity season. Student must be well rounded and in academic good standing. All things being equal, HABC membership may be considered.

43. Hicksville Baseball Association (HBA) Scholarship

Amount Two \$500.00 Scholarships will be awarded. One male, one female, first choice. Criteria: A student must be graduating Hicksville High School in the year of the application. Academics must be in good standing. They must have plans to attend a university, college, or trade school in the fall following graduation. They must have participated in HBA for at least one year. **Students must submit an essay with a minimum of two hundred words** on “How has being part of HBA influenced my life”. No financial information is required.

44. Hicksville Boys & Girls Club

Amount Two (2) \$500.00 Scholarships. Criteria: Students must be a graduating Hicksville resident involved with the club. There will be two scholarships awarded. He/She must show active participation in any type of community service and involvement with the Hicksville Boys & Girls Club. A personal interview is required. **If you are interested in this scholarship, you must pick up a separate application either at the Guidance Office or at the Hicksville Boys & Girls Club, located at 79 West Old Country Road, Hicksville, New York.**

45. Hicksville Chamber of Commerce Scholarship

(2) Awards. Amount \$500.00 each. Criteria: Student must be accepted to a two- or four-year accredited college, university or trade school. **Must reside in Hicksville and show active participation in community service to Hicksville. If you are interested in this scholarship you must pick up a separate application in the Guidance Office.**

46. Hicksville Community Council Scholarship

(1) Amount \$500.00. Criteria: Graduating senior of Hicksville High School. The student must demonstrate that they have worked for making Hicksville a better place through active participation in volunteering in community service performed **ONLY IN HICKSVILLE**. Interested students should submit a statement of their participation in such activities, including the names and telephone numbers of adults in charge of the service completed. Academic standing and financial need are not required for this scholarship. **Only applicants that complete the requirements as requested will be considered.**

47. Hicksville Congress of Teachers - Elliot Paisner Memorial Scholarship

Amount \$1,000.00. Criteria: Open to all students who have chosen teaching as their major in college. Selection criteria includes financial need, academic achievement, extracurricular activities and an **essay** describing a Hicksville teacher's impact on your education and his/her influence on your career goal. To qualify, students must be accepted to a teacher education program at a four-year college or university. **Please pick up the additional application from the guidance office. The completed application with all required documents must be returned directly to Hicksville Congress of Teachers, 535 S. Broadway, Suite 212, Hicksville, Hicksville, NY 11801.**

48. Hicksville Congress of Teachers-Mary D'Andrea Memorial Union Service Scholarship

Amount \$500.00. Criteria: Open to students who will be attending a college or university on a full-time basis **and whose parent(s) or step-parent(s) is an in-service member of any union.** Selection criteria includes financial need, academic achievement, and an **essay** describing the importance of union membership. **Please pick up the additional application from the guidance office. The completed application with all required documents must be returned directly to Hicksville Congress of Teachers, 535 S. Broadway, Suite 212, Hicksville, Hicksville, NY 11801.**

49. Hicksville Congress of Teachers Commitment to Community Service Award

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: Open to all students who can demonstrate an ongoing commitment to a community service project spanning a minimum of 1 year. Selection criteria includes financial need, good grades, and school attendance and an **essay** describing the impact of your community service on your personal growth. **Please pick up the additional application from the guidance office. The completed application with all required documents must be returned directly to Hicksville Congress of Teachers, 535 S. Broadway, Suite 212, Hicksville, Hicksville, NY 11801.**

50. Hicksville Congress of Teachers - Elaine Milani Memorial Scholarship

This award will be made without preference as to gender, color, creed or religion. **Two letters of recommendation/verification from community leaders, and sponsors, and/or individuals who can attest to your community service are required. Only COMPLETE applications will be considered.**

102. Kiwanis Foundation of Hicksville in Honor of GeKun Park

Amount \$1,000.00. This award was established by Shany Park, Hicksville High School Class of 1990. This award, in honor of her father, is open to all Hicksville High School graduating seniors who were born outside of the United States. The student must demonstrate strong social involvement/community service. To be considered, the student must be attending a four year university or college in September. This scholarship is awarded without preference as to gender, color, creed or religion. **Two letters of recommendation are required: 1) one from community leader/sponsors and/or individuals who can attest to your community service. 2) One from a teacher/counselor who can speak to your scholarship. Only COMPLETE applications will be considered.**

103. Kiwanis Foundation of Hicksville - Philip M. Tornatore, DDS Health Care Scholarship

Amount \$1,000.00. This scholarship is open to all Hicksville High School graduating seniors. To be considered, the student must be attending an institute of high learning in the healthcare field. Preference will be given to those students who are pursuing study in the field of dentistry and who demonstrate involvement in community service. **Two letters of recommendation are required: 1) one from a teacher in the health/science field and 2) a personal reference from a teacher, counselor or employer. Amount \$1,000.00. This scholarship is open to all Hicksville High School graduating seniors. This scholarship is awarded without preference as to gender, color, creed or religion. Community service in the health field will be an important consideration. **Two letters of recommendation are required: 1) One from a community leader who can attest to your community service in the health field. 2) One from a teacher or school administrator attesting to your academic achievements and interest in the field of nursing service. The Rojas family is committed to serving the needs of others and through this award hope to help a graduating senior who is also committed to service. The recipient of the scholarship must demonstrate outstanding service to school as well as the larger community. It is open to students majoring in the fine arts. The student must demonstrate financial need. This scholarship is awarded without preference as to gender, color, creed or religion. **Three letters of recommendation are required: 1) One from a community leader who can attest to your community service. 2) One from a teacher or school administrator attesting to your school service. 3) One from an art teacher attesting to your artistic ability. Only COMPLETE applications will be considered.**

106. Brian J. Thomas Memorial Scholarship

Brian was a member of the graduating class of 1988. He was known by all for his impeccable wit and sense of humor. Brian had a gift to bring levity to the worst situations. His unique approach to life not only earned him the title of Class Clown, but also enabled him to overcome learning challenges, and be recognized as “The Most Improved Student” of the class of 1988. In addition to being an incredibly active father of four, Brian was a volunteer in his community, working with the Wounded Warriors, Children of Hope, and other charities. After working as a correction officer for years, he was ultimately promoted to an instructor at the Nassau County Correctional Academy. 114. Jeremy Katz Memorial Scholarship

Amount (1) \$500.00. Criteria: This scholarship will be awarded to a graduation senior from Hicksville High School who also attended Fork Lane elementary school and is pursuing higher studies in the field of Art. Must be an average student with a grade point average not higher than 90%. This student should be self-motivated with a strong will to excel through hard work and practice. **The student must submit an essay** about why he/she is deserving of this scholarship and **a teacher letter of recommendation.**

115. Nassau County Police Activity League Kevin Kolm Memorial Scholarship

Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000.00 each will be awarded to two graduating seniors, 2 scholarships will be awarded each year, funding permitting. Must go on for further education such as, college, vocational, trade school, etc. Student may only receive one of the four scholarships given by the Old Country Road PTA, but may apply and receive other scholarships. The student must be planning to attend a two- or four-year college, or trade/vocational school. 123. The Joey Lup Foundation Scholarship

Joey Luparello attended Fork Lane Elementary School, Hicksville Middle School and graduated from Hicksville High School in 1990. He was an average student and had a passion for sports. Joe played both baseball and football for the Hicksville Comets. He continued to play on various teams as an adult. Joe lost his battle with cancer on November 17, 2014 at the age of 42. Joe was the guy who lit up a room, made everyone happy, and was a friend to all. His kind ways and charming manner were what drew people to him.

Two (2) scholarships will be awarded. Amount: \$500.00 each. Criteria: A graduating senior, who anticipates attending either a two- or four-year school, has a GPA of an 80% or better, has a passion for sports, and participated in sports during his/her high school years. **Students must submit an essay.** The topic is: Every family has been touched by cancer in some way or another. Please explain how you, or your family, have been affected by cancer and the impact it had. **Students interested in this scholarship must pick up a separate application in the Guidance Office.**

124. Terry Wallace Student-Lacrosse Player Scholarship

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: This scholarship is awarded to a graduating boy or girl who is a member of the varsity lacrosse team and is continuing their education. **A short essay** explaining the applicant's long-range goals are required for consideration.

Criteria: The successful candidate must be accepted to a four-year college or university and be pursuing an education in the pediatric medical field. To qualify the student must have a grade point average of 85% or better. **The student must be nominated by a teacher and MUST submit the following with the application: An essay of 250 to 500 words** explaining why he/she is deserving of this scholarship. Amount \$1,000.00. Criteria: The student must be a graduate of both Dutch Lane Elementary and Hicksville High School. They must demonstrate academic achievement and have participated in district and community activities. They must also plan to enthusiastically pursue educational or vocational goals.

Amount \$500.00 Criteria: A student of average ability, one who shows social involvement, community service and will be pursuing studies in Education. Candidate must be a Woodland Elementary School alumnus and a Current Hicksville High School Senior planning to attend College.
